JUPALLY SLAMS MODI OVER KRISHNA WATERS

Excise minister Jupally Krishna Rao on Monday condemned the comments made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi over Krishna waters. Addressing media persons at the Secretariat, he said that the Central government is hesitating to settle Telangana's share of Krishna waters.

The BJP government has no moral right to seek votes in Telangana without first set-

tling the water share.
The BJP government merged seven mandals of Khammam district into Andhra Pradesh but why is it not providing the state's due share of Krishna waters, he wondered. Why is the Palamuru-Ranga Reddy lift scheme not being given national status?, he asked.

"It is ironic that Modi accused BRS and Congress parties of corruption and nepotism. Former prime min-isters Indira Gandhi and Rajiv Gandhi had sacrificed their lives for the country. Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi have not taken the Prime Minister's post even when they could. There is a need for the Congress government to come to power at the Centre,' the minister said.

STATE UPDATES HC **OVER MEDIGADDA BARRAGE PROBE**

A two-judge bench of the Telangana High Court on Monday took on file a detailed statement of Advocate-General A. Sudarshan Reddy on the developments relating to the Kaleshwaram lift irrigation scheme (Klis) and three of its criticai barrages

The bench was dealing with two writ pleas filed by TPCC senior vice-president G. Niranjan. The bench questioned the petitioner for approaching the court in the cusp of an election. Petitioner's counsel said the damage to the Medigadda barrage was noted in October last.

The government said that it had moved the National Dam Safety Authority which had constituted a sixmember committee to deal with the distress situation of the three barrages. Recording the statement of the state government that officers who were hitherto in-charge had either been terminated or released, the bench observed that it would await for its appraisal. The court accordingly posted the matter to July.

Implement LRS without fee: KTR

The BRS on Monday demanded that the Congress government keep its pre-election promise of implementing a free Land Regularisation Scheme (LRS) and warned of an agitation if the government went ahead with its plans to collect hefty fees from applicants.

Party working president K.T. Rama Rao, addressing a press conference, said that the government was seeking to collect around ₹20,000 crore in fee from the 25.44 lakh LRS applications, with each applicant expected to pay ₹1 lakh on an Rama Rao said that

The long-awaited dream of the people of the Old City will fructify on Friday when Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy will lay the foundation stone for the Old City Metro rall project

Phase I Metro rail work stretching to 5.5 km from MGBS to Falaknuma of corridor II and Green Line JBS to Falaknuma did not go beyond the proposal stage. Taking due note of this, Reddy focussed his attention on the Old City metro and directed HMRL offi-cials to take it up on a priority basis.
